NORD

The New Orleans Recreation Department (NORD) was created by City Ordinance No. 16,630 on September 27, 1946 under Mayor deLesseps "Chep" Morrison. In 2005, the City of New Orleans suffered one of the nation's largest and costliest natural and manmade disaster which damaged or destroyed 90% of NORD's facilities. Larry accepted the call to become Interim Director of NORD in summer of 2006. Larry's initial role was to stabilize NORD's facilities and jump start the rebuilding of the department which withstood an estimated total in damages of \$63 million dollars, a staff reduced from 264 to 16 employees, and an annual operating budget reduced from \$8.7 million to \$87,000 to restart programs.

Larry forged ahead and launched an unprecedented public and private campaign to restore recreational services for the youth and families of the city of New Orleans. Larry forged partnerships with local agencies, local sports franchises and a host of public, private, corporate and philanthropic organizations to redevelop and restore recreation facilities and programs citywide.

Under Larry's leadership, NORD's staff increased from 16 to 80 employees, re-opened more than 95 facilities, and revived multiple dormant youth and seniors programs. Larry worked closely with the Mayor, City Council members, elected officials and countless community stakeholders and volunteers to grow NORD's programs and budget to \$5.5 million dollars with an additional \$1million dollars in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and state appropriated funds.

- Facing a recovery that was underfunded and understaffed, Larry Barabino worked with closely with community, corporate and non-profit partners to re-opened playgrounds, facilities and play spots throughout the City.
- FEMA utilized 15 NORD playgrounds and facilities to offer temporary housing to residents
- Working in conjunction with the cities Capital Projects Department
 - Managed 23 "quick hit projects" that include playground field lights, fencing, tennis courts and basketball courts
 - Managed the FEMA restoration of the 15 FEMA trailer sites to its pre-trailer site condition
 - Managed the Restoration of High Mass Ball Field lights at 37 Facilities worth \$3,043,815
 - Managed the replacement and distribution of equipment and sports teams' uniforms






BASKETBALL PARTICIPATION Number of youth participating increased as citizens returned, but 2018 shows a decline in youth sports participation






NORDC TODAY: TRACK & FIELD PARTICIPATION


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
NORDC TODAY: BASEBALL PARTICIPATION


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NORDC TODAY: FOOTBALL PARTICIPATION








SPECIAL OLYMPICS
