- \$1.8 million renovation funded by FEMA public assistance, Disaster Community
 Development Block Grant (D-CDBG) funds
 and City Bond funds





- Opened in 1910 and is 3rd oldest playground in the city
- New baseball field
- Resurfaced basketball court
- Repairs to the fences and gates
- Upgrades to the restroom facilities and concession stand



- New brick plaza with benches and tables
- After the ribbon cutting, St. Roch volunteer coaches led baseball and basketball clinics for the kids on the restored baseball diamond and basketball court.
