State of NORD Post Hurricane Ida Report

NORD in partnership with NOHD and NOHSEP opened and staffed Rosenwald Recreation Center as an emergency shelter on Saturday August 28th for Hurricane Ida and housed 90 residents. The emergency shelter closed on Monday immediately after the storm passed. On Tuesday, August 31st, Rosenwald Center transitioned into a Cooling/Charging Center and meals were provided by World Central Kitchen. On Wednesday, we opened seven (7) additional Cooling/Charging Centers (Listed Below) in partnership with the NOHSEP, NOLA Ready, RTA and LASPCA to provide families with airconditioned facilities, electronic equipment charging capabilities, WIFI, meals and supportive services. These facilities were managed by NORD's reserve staff member, NOLA Ready Staff, volunteers and employees from other city departments from 8am to 6pm daily. I want to send a special thanks to Commissioner Theo Sanders for volunteering at the Cut Off Cooling/Charging Center post Hurricane Ida. We had a total of 20,855 resident visits at the eight (8) Cooling/Charging Centers from September 1st to September 10th.
